

Investing in your water future



Allconnex Water is constructing wastewater storage facilities near 17 critical pump stations in the Logan district.

The aim of this project is to increase local wastewater storage capacity and reduce potential overflows in the event of power failures or other emergencies.

Works are currently under way at four locations within Edens Landing and Rochedale South, with future works planned for Bethania, Browns Plains, Cornubia and Eagleby.

The project is estimated to cost \$8.8 million with works at all sites scheduled for completion by November 2011.

These works will provide community and environmental benefits by reducing potential wastewater overflows to stormwater or local watercourses around the pump station sites.

Allconnex Water is investing significantly in Logan, with more than \$60 million being spent on upgrading water and wastewater infrastructure.

Disruptions

Every effort is being made to minimise disturbance or inconvenience to the community during these works.

Customers in the immediate vicinity may be impacted by general construction activities including increased levels of noise, dust and odour, as well as more frequent truck movements and temporary traffic changes during working hours.
