

Investing in your water future



Allconnex Water will be improving its water services in Dunwich with the construction of a 250,000-litre reservoir on Illawong Crescent.

The facility will help to increase water pressure in the supply network and fire-fighting storage capacity.

Customers will notice a significant difference in water flows from everyday devices such as taps, shower heads and hoses.

Construction of the reservoir and connection to the network will take approximately three weeks.

Allconnex Water is investing significantly in the Redlands with more than \$50 million estimated to be spent over the next five years on water and wastewater infrastructure.

The water supply will be temporarily affected when the reservoir is connected to the existing network.

Customers in the elevated areas of Dunwich along Rainbow Crescent and Illawong Crescent will be notified before any disruptions occur.

The facts

Compared to the original budget inherited from council water businesses, in its first year of operation alone Allconnex has delivered over \$200 million in capital works savings.

There will be at least a further \$260 million in capital works savings for the next four years. This is due to our large economies of scale and by working across three districts.
