

Investing in your water future




Allconnex Water is building vital infrastructure along the Old Pacific Highway, Oxenford, as part of a \$5 million project to improve the water supply for residents and fire-fighting purposes.

Approximately 200 metres of new 100mm water main will be built, which will increase water pressure and flow in the network.

Work is scheduled to commence on 1 July and to be completed by 15 July.

Construction will include digging open trenches, with minor disruptions along the pedestrian footpath.

What to expect

Disruptions

Most of the new main will be built on Gold Coast City Council land, adjacent to the Old Pacific Highway, with minimal disturbance to property owners. Pedestrian management will be in place.

Partial road closures may be necessary and motorists are urged to obey the directions of traffic control officers.

Working hours

Construction will generally occur between 7am and 5pm Monday to Friday, and between 8am and 3pm on Saturday
