Allconnex displays environmental commitment

Allconnex Water is undertaking a comprehensive Vegetation Management Program on the banks of Oxley Creek at Forestdale.

The Greenwood Lakes Reserve will be rehabilitated into a green community space, with seven main activities to be delivered over the next three-and-a-half years.

These activities include seed collecting/propagation; staged weed removal; erosion control; planting of native species; mulching, soil treatment and watering; installation of nest boxes, logs and other fauna habitat; and monitoring of the program.

Allconnex Chief Operating Officer Paul Heaton says the project is part of Allconnex's environmental commitment.

"Upon completion, the local community will be able to enjoy 12 hectares of green space, which was formerly a sand mine," he said.

"The Greenwood Lakes Reserve Vegetation Management Program is one of many ways we contribute to the environment as part of our normal operations to provide high-quality water and wastewater services to customers."

Allconnex maintains an environmental management system that is used on all project works. This system is in line with international standards that ensure all activities are carried out in an environmentally responsible manner.

The business is also a contributing member of the south east Queensland Healthy Waterways program, which aims to protect and enhance waterways in the region.

The Greenwood Lakes Reserve Vegetation Management Program is being undertaken in partnership with Logan City Council.
