

Investing in your water future



Allconnex Water is increasing its water storage capacity to cater for future growth in the New Beith and Flagstone areas.

Construction is under way on a 20 million litre water reservoir, access road and associated infrastructure, just off New Beith Road.

The project, estimated to cost more than \$14 million, is scheduled for completion in early 2012.

Logan City's south-west region was identified as a hub for future residential and industrial development in the State Government's

What to expect

Every effort is being made to minimise disruption to the community during these works.

Construction will generally occur between 6.30am and 6.30pm Monday to Saturday. At times, residents may notice more frequent truck movements and temporary traffic changes along New Beith Road.

Given the remote site location, general construction impacts should be minimal. Local residents will be notified at least 48 hours prior to any significant activities.
